Enhance Our Environment Committee collaborates with Ivy AKAdemy to share information with youth

The Enhance Our Environment Committee of Beta Delta Omega in collaboration with the Ivy AKAdemy concluded a two-part session on May 11, 2023, with eight kids in the after-school program at the Bethlehem Center in Jackson, Mississippi.

Each session was designed to engage the kids and teach them the importance of planting trees, how the ecosystem works and how trees are important to our daily lives. Prior to starting the second session activity, the committee recapped the activity from the first session. The kids eagerly reminded committee members what was learned from *The Lorax* – a book they read in the first session. They recalled that trees are important because they are a source of food for humans and animals, that trees help clean the air of pollutants and that pollutants are bad for the soil and could stop the trees from growing. The children also recalled enjoying completing *The Lorax* activity worksheet.

In the second session, the committee members helped the children decorate pots and planted potted flowers for their mothers for Mother's Day. Allowing the kids to participate in planting and tending to the flowers helped them build a meaningful connection of learning how to garden, promoted respect and responsibility for the planet, and presented a unique learning experience. Sorors enjoyed the event, and several mentioned they look forward to returning to the farm to plant more trees.

On January 16, 2023, in partnership with Metro Jackson National Pan Hellenic Council, the Juanita Sims Doty Foundation and the Erick Dampier Foundation, Beta Delta Omega met from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at City Plaza, 2640 Terry Road in Jackson, Mississippi. BDO sorors collected coats, winter accessories, canned goods, and paper goods. All items were distributed to Stewpot Community Services, Billy Brumfield House, and various senior facilities in Jackson.

Empower Our Families

Alpha Kappa Alpha has a strong history of supporting and servicing families, for we understand a healthy family is the foundation of a healthy community. Empower Our Families is anchored in the belief that it is necessary to provide solution-building services that help address the most pressing needs for each family unit at key life stages beginning with childhood to senior life.

Childhood Hunger Initiative Power Packs (CHIPP™) – Beta Delta Omega has delivered weekly "Power Pack" meals over the weekend and holidays to 63 students at Lester Elementary School in the Jackson Public School District. From January to May, the chapter has packed and delivered 1,085 Power Packs.









Mental Health Awareness

In collaboration with Gamma Omicron Chapter at Tougaloo College, Beta Delta Omega raised awareness and encouraged treatment for adults and families dealing with depression, anxiety, and trauma. The May 6 event included the following speakers: Dr. Tonya Hays (mindful breathing), Jamie Evans (certified mental health therapist), Corporal Anthony Johnson (Jackson Police Department - Crisis Intervention Coordinator), Soror Alexia Hammonds (yoga instructor), Soror Tritresher Sizer (BDO) and Soror Tonya Tate (BDO).



Enhance Our Environment

The Soaring Administration has selected top key strategies to optimize Alpha Kappa Alpha's ability to improve and protect the environment. Beta Delta Omega sorors planted over 100 trees on Arbor Day, hosted a shredding event in June in collaboration with Tougaloo College, Gamma Omicron of Tougaloo College and Gamma Rho of Jackson State University, and collaborated with the Bethlehem Center and YLI. Other activities included placement of a recycling bin for plastic water bottles in the BDO Center, providing members with energy efficient kits from Entergy, collaboration with CAP Beautification to plant tulips in the raised flower bed, and participation in the Sip, Plant & Paint Sisterly Relations activity.











Advocate for Social Justice

In response to the growing need to advocate for disenfranchised and marginalized communities, Beta

Delta Omega sorors partnered with Women for Progress for a legislative candidate forum, challenged sorors to register at least one person to vote, and attended the 95th Annual Freedom Fund Banquet.
